

## **REVIEW: April 18 Harborside Brass**

Florida weather cooperated nicely for the final outdoor performance produced by our own Punta Gorda Symphony. Once again, impeccably organized, and mindful of health safety precautions, the Symphony attracted a manageable audience for three identical concerts on Sunday afternoon, performed by the Harborside Brass, consisting of Symphony members Richard Stoelzel and Jeff Kaye on trumpet, Jennifer Miller on horn, Karla Rojas on trombone, and Todd Handley on tuba.

The stage and seating area was adjacent to the popular Tiki Bar at Four Points by Sheraton, but the

audience extended out onto the water, where we were very comfortably positioned dockside to enjoy the show. The music was nicely amplified and completely audible from the boat, but unfortunately, we were not able to hear the speakers who introduced each segment – and I know, from experience, that there were plenty of educational and entertaining tidbits throughout for those seated on the lawn!

The program opened with a medley of familiar favorite numbers from Leonard Bernstein's *West Side Story* and continued with a variety of styles and composers, including a March by Prokofiev, contemporary works by Kevin McKee, Michael Kamen, and an arrangement of "Happy" by Pharrell Williams which included an audience participation of syncopated hand clapping. Very fun.

Most notable in the concert were selections from George Gershwin's jazzy *Porgy and Bess*, as well as Clyde McCoy's "Sugar Blues" where the trumpets were given the opportunity to show off music written with the instrument in mind.
